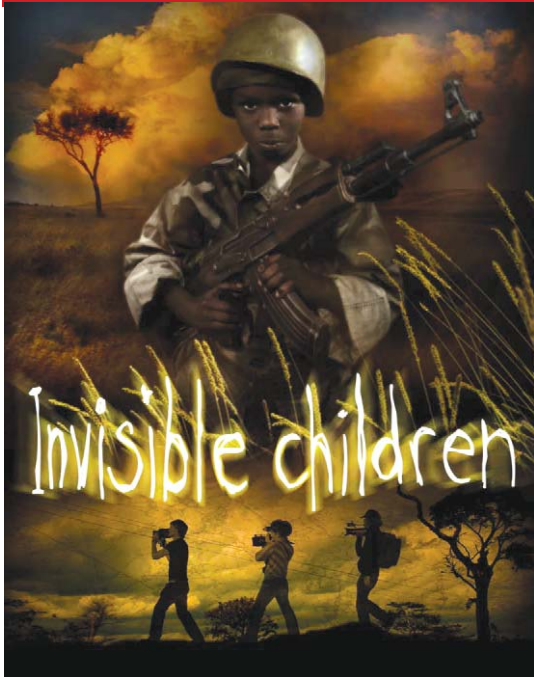


NEW AT UNIRONDAK THIS SUMMER!

“Invisible Children”

Invisible Children is a non profit organization working to raise awareness and improve the lives of children affected by war in Uganda. They will be working with Unirondack campers and staff this summer. Join us for a inspiring and life-changing moment in Unirondack history!

About Invisible Children: In the spring of 2003, three young filmmakers traveled to Africa in search of a story. What started out as a filmmaking adventure transformed into much more when these boys from Southern California discovered a tragedy that disgusted and inspired them, a tragedy where children are both the weapons and the victims.

After returning to the States, they created the documentary **"Invisible Children: Rough Cut,"** a film that exposes the tragic realities of northern Uganda's night commuters and child soldiers.

The film was originally shown to friends and family, but has now been seen by millions of people. The overwhelming response has been, "How can I help?" To answer this question, the non-profit Invisible Children, Inc. was created, giving compassionate individuals an effective way to respond to the situation.

Invisible Children work to transform apathy into activism. By documenting the lives of those living in regions of conflict and injustice, they hope to educate and inspire individuals in the Western world to use their unique voice for change. Their films and media efforts create an opportunities for young people to become part of a grassroots movement that intelligently responds to what's happening in the world.

Some of the Invisible Children staff will be coming to camp and training our staff during orientation week. **As a result some of the camp staff will be leading workshops and one-shots throughout the summer on peace activism and social change.**

The generous folks from Invisible Children will return for part of **Channing I** to show a film and work directly with campers. This initiative will continue during **Channing II** as our staff lead a week long, optional, workshop for campers. This workshop will allow campers to use their special skills and interest to support the work of Invisible Children and the people of Uganda.
